

Dorchester on Thames Parking Map

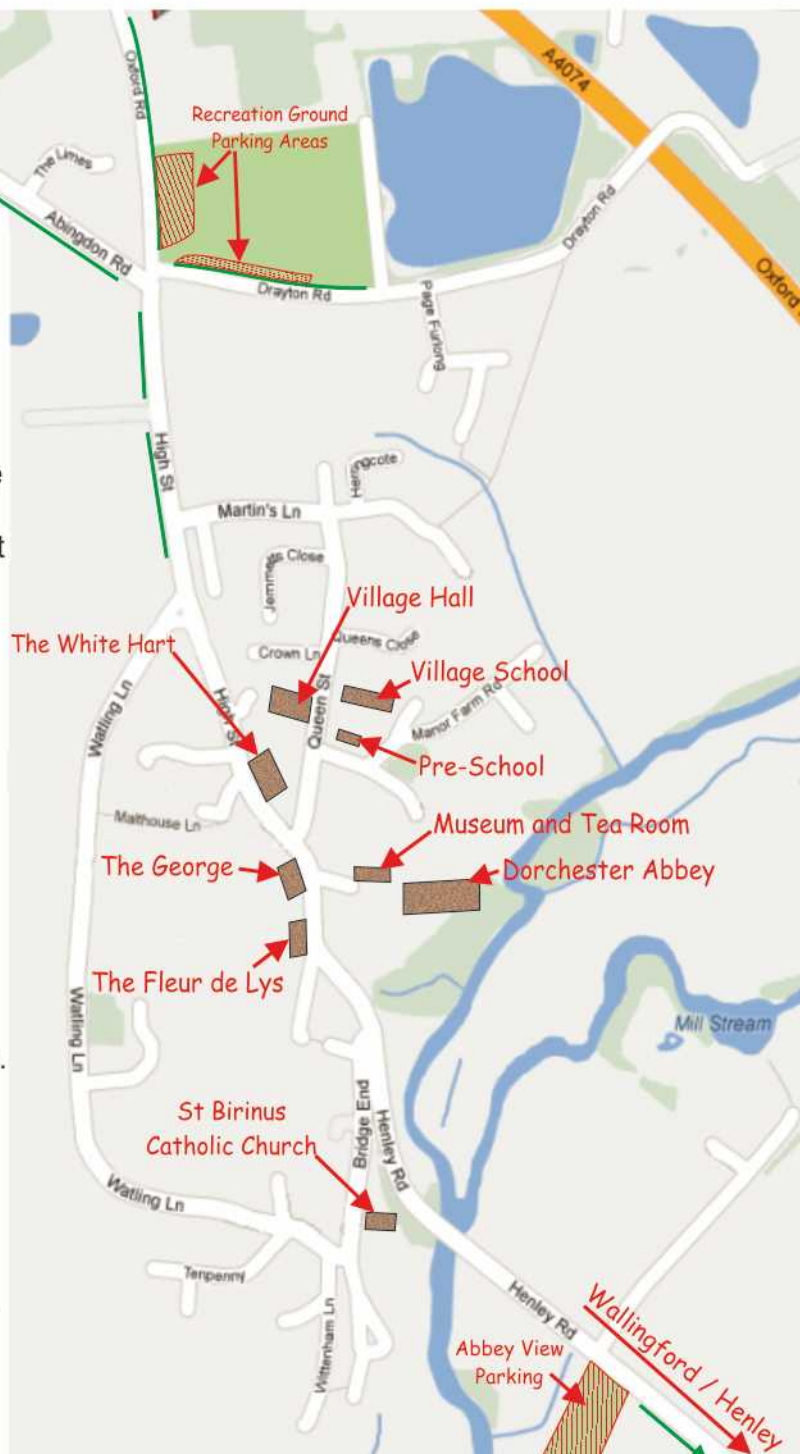
Off-road Event Parking Areas

Please follow signs to the parking areas in the Recreation Ground at the Oxford end of the village and/or 'Abbey View' to the south. Please note that Abbey View tends to be used during the period of Summer Time but only when weather is dry.

Some event organisers operate a park 'n ride service between the Recreation Ground and the Abbey for at least an hour before the start of a performance and then for as long as required afterwards. The Abbey is a 10-15 minute walk from the Recreation Ground.

Should these parking areas be shut due to bad weather, visitors should park on the roads near the Recreation Ground as indicated by the green lines on the map. Also indicated by the green line in the bottom right corner of the map there is room for cars to park along Henley Road between the Thames Water Treatment Plant and Meadside.

Abingdon Road, High Street and Henley Road are the bus route through the village and must be kept clear at all times so that the buses can pass. Please do not park your vehicle anywhere where it may prevent the passage of emergency vehicles.



There are a very few disabled parking spaces available within the Abbey grounds which can be booked in advance. Please contact the organiser of the event you are attending, giving the make and registration number of the vehicle, to apply for an Abbey parking permit at least 48 hours beforehand. If you cannot contact the organiser, please email events@dorchester-abbey.org.uk or call 01865 340007. In addition there are two disabled parking spaces in the public car park at Bridge End and two on the High Street. These are available on a first-come, first-served basis.

The hotels/pubs as marked all have off-road car parking spaces, but for their patrons only. Neither the Village Hall nor the Village School have any significant off-road parking areas.
